Venue bookings 2006/7 season: Are enclosed together with the Throop Beat 2 closure dates – please ensure you cut this out and put in your permit.

• **New Waters:** Delighted to advise of two new stillwater complex's. For those who haven't picked up the leaflet from the tackle shops or off the web, the relevant maps are enclosed. Please cut these out and put in your permit book (Pre May 2006).

Whitemoor fishery (2 miles North of Ferndown) is open to members in the winter (October – March) but can be fished outside this period by purchasing a day ticket. A wonderful addition in so much that it fishes almost as well in the winter as the summer; one match this winter we had to break the ice in order to fish, you can't get it much colder than that, yet 47lbs of Carp to 5lbs won the match and there were many weights over 20lbs of skimmers and roach. About the only fish that didn't show on this match was the tench. Main lake is a truly mixed fishery, the canal is mainly carp and tench. Toilets on site, very easy access (including less abled) and all swims are platformed.

Whinwhistle Fisheries (2 miles West off Jct. 2 M27) is open to members all year round but you must book-in with your permit at the fishing lodge before going onto the waters and while you're at the lodge, bait, tackle, hot food, drinks and toilets are all available. A complex of 3 beautifully landscaped lakes, with all swims platformed (including special less-abled swims) and easy access. Although there is a reasonable head of carp to medium size, the complex is mainly a mixed fishery of tench, perch, bream, skimmers and a huge amount of roach. It is therefore a slightly different, and an absolutely ideal, addition to our waters.

For the trout enthusiast, there is also 4 stocked lakes (browns & rainbows) and approximately 1 mile of the River Blackwater (grayling and sea trout) which can be fished by arranging and purchasing the relevant day permit from the fishing lodge (01794 324485).

• **Stillwater News:** Due to its popularity, effective April 1st

Parley Lakes will be for members and members guests only, no day tickets.

Northfield main lake has had a further stocking of F1 Carp. Floating islands, which will be filled with plants, are being erected in the works point bay to restrict casting and a new weed planting programme is under way. Additionally, a trial marine walkway pontoon is being installed on the caravan bank to give access to this bank; this is a fairly expensive operation but if successful will be extended along this bank as funds permit.

A container has been installed in the main car-park to store our club equipment and plans are in hand to commence fencing the whole area.

The Wash pit has seen a further stocking of 2lbs Bream and twice last season we have trialed a weed cutting boat.

Hightown has received a stocking of 2lbs Bream. Securing a very long lease on the railway access is now in its final legal stages and due to the enhanced surface of this access, we are applying for extinguishment of the existing footpath along the railway bank. If successful it will allow us to move the fence back and give much better access.

Finally, on the stillwater side, I welcome John Sudworth as the new lakes manager and Trevor Childs as asst. lakes manager. Keith Hayward our past manager did some excellent work and we thank him most sincerely but, due to work pressures, he felt he could not currently give adequate time to the job. John and Trevor already have some major plans in place and I wish them both well and hope that you, the members, will give them your full support.

• **River News:** We have purchased outright two of our existing fisheries and a third is currently at the legal stage; this together with the lease on the railway line at Hightown has attributed to our cash deficit over 2005/6 but money very well spent as an investment.

The new platforms and graveled path access at **Redbrook** is now complete; an expensive project but it has transformed the

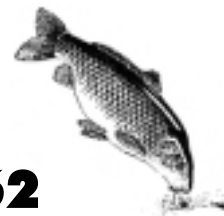

fishery and allows easy access to all swims. You don't need waders anymore, slippers are fine! The new gate in front of the old garage at **Brownsies** will be our access for this water but members must not drive right down by the river – a parking area behind the old garage is signed.

The track to **Havelins** has been scraped and the potholes repaired and thanks to Ron Perman, a swing gate is now installed on the West side of the old railway bridge, so access to the downstream section is now much easier via walking under the old railway bridge.

• **Discipline:** Not too bad a season overall (thanks members) excepting the lead crack offs at Northfield, which the floating islands will hopefully deal with once and for all but the new management regime on the stillwaters will be quite rightly, zero tolerance so I bring to your attention problems that are occurring and will be dealt with severely:

• Litter – usual request – take it home with you. Don't leave it tied up in a bag on or just outside the fishery.

• Fires – it is a club rule, no fires, yet many of the 'night' swims have evidence of the ashes! This may be anglers burning their litter but whatever it is **don't light fires of any description.**

• Railway access Hightown – part of our lease contract is that litter, obstructing the bridleway and speeding down the track is not acceptable. It's taken us over 30 years to secure this access – don't let it loose!



• Locking Gates – much better this season but there are still a few members who just won't spend 20 seconds to close and lock gates behind them. Do, it's for your security.

• Hightown Access – it has been brought to our attention that a few members have been gaining access to the lake (annex area) via Watership drive, off Forestlake avenue. This is not an official access area, do not use.

• **Committee:** Ken Broddle is leaving the post of Permits Secretary this year. When Ken took over, membership stood around 700, its now 1600, additionally he has completely instigated a new members database which makes for far easier operation. On behalf of all Ken, sincere thanks for your dedication and lets hope you now get more time to get some fishing in.

We also lose our day ticket co-ordinator Andy Smith who is moving to Bath. The shops will miss him and so will we, again sincere thanks Andy for your dedication and lets hope you find some rod benders on the Bristol Avon.

Thanks to all the committee who have done sterling work as usual, this year, also to Ringwood Tackle, Christchurch Angling Centre, Southern Angler magazine and PA Megabait for their most generous prizes, advertising and support over the season. They support us – please support them.

• **Publicity/Venue guides - tuition:** There seems to be a growing demand for on-venue tutorials and some members are already involved in offering this. As with publicity and articles done on our waters, we have no objection to these, in fact support them but on the proviso that, out of courtesy if nothing else, the club is prior informed at all times. Please action for future either by letting myself, Lakes, Rivers or Throop managers or Asst. Secretary, know, in advance.

Asst SECRETARY/PRESS OFFICER

I have been around the club for some 25 years. Originally match/pleasure orientated but now focusing mainly on the rivers for the bigger specimens! I joined the committee just over two years ago and have made a conscious effort to try and make a difference.

• **Hampshire Avon:** This is my main project at present, to improve our Avon fisheries.

Over the last two years I have been laying the foundations of a fishery action plan for the Severals to try and improve fry recruitment and general habitat. Following several meetings with the Environmental Agency, English Nature, riparian owners and Sparsholt College we now have approval for implementation this spring, of some experimental flow deflectors.

Additionally I am in regular communication with the EA regarding the Avon weed cut and hope that recent positive meetings are followed with positive actions by the EA this summer. Once the consents for work are in place I will be keeping the membership informed through regular updates on the website. As things progress we may also be looking for volunteers to assist so if you're interested keep an eye on the website.

I'm sure many other river fisheries could benefit from this type of attention and in time we will try to improve as many waters as possible but for now we have to focus on one and get it right.

• **Website:** Another project is communication with members and already I have created the forums on the website which now has nearly 120 members (its free so follow the instructions on the website and join up - lets make it 200 this season). Once your forums membership is activated you can go in and ask questions of the committee, find out what the

waters are fishing like or get some useful advise on methods etc. Even if you just want to have a bit of banter the forums is a great place to chat.

I am currently updating the format of our website so we will be looking for articles; pictures and anything else of club interest so please send me anything you think may be suitable and be sure that anything already submitted will be used as and when the new site is activated.

• **New Forest Show:** Some of you may know the club supports the fishing/have-a-go casting area at the New Forest Show. We are always looking for volunteers to help with the casting tuition for the youngsters so if you fancy a day at the show and spending a few hours putting something back please contact me and arrange to help (free entry, cooked breakfast if you're early enough, refreshments and lunch are supplied).

• **Press coverage:** We have had virtually every fishery in our book featured in Anglers Mail this season thanks to Ray Walton, also Steve Martin who continues to support the club with regular features in Southern Angler. Andy Little, Stef Horak and Phil Smith amongst others have all mentioned Ringwood & DAA in the press and helped our growing membership; cheers guys!

If you are lucky enough to catch that fish of a lifetime or just want to report a catch I would be happy to take your call or receive an email. I would also be happy to come along and photograph something special (time/circumstances permitting) so don't be shy, give me a call and get your picture on the new and improved web site.

A pity but constant warnings about this problem had not been heeded. These will eventually be replaced by planted, floating islands.

TREASURER

The deadline for newsletter copy this year is before our financial year-end so I will give you the basic picture as I write with the full audited accounts available at the May AGM.

Expecting a slight loss this year, subject to the weather over the last few weeks of the season, which can affect Throop day ticket sales. I am not concerned as this is due to non-recurring expenditure as part of our decision to purchase some of waters outright. It's always preferable to buy your own house than to rent and no different with angling. It's a great investment opportunity and in the long-term, security of our venues.

The purchase of the middle stretch of our Parley, Stour water, now gives us freehold on the whole of this stretch and as I'm sure you know if you have been there, it is one of the best mixed fishery stretches on the whole river. Additionally we have purchased a 125 year lease on the railway line access at Hightown and transformed Redbrook. These three items alone have cost over £40,000, so without these we would have shown a profit of around £20,000

As part of the overall railway line purchase Hampshire County Council have now agreed in principle, the extinguishment of the footpath on our land adjacent to the old railway. This is going out to public appeal shortly and, if no objections, we will then be able to move our boundary fence six feet to give better access to the railway bank. Also there are planned

improvements to the blind corner entering the railway line and further parking.

Two other currently rented waters are now at the legal stage of being purchased, so I anticipate a loss next year as well but I estimate that if the properties we will own were still rented we would be paying more than an extra £20,000 a year in rents. Long term it is the right move even if a little short term pain is born today.

One other major increase is Insurance. We have paid a fairly constant £400 a year; this year we will have paid just under £3,000 and even with this, the current public liability insurance of £5m is deemed too low and we may have to specify £10m. We have cover for accidental injury and currently have no plans to stop this but there may come a time that cover is prohibitive and we would revert to just having the legal minimum public liability.

Overall, with the ever increasing membership and further new waters taken on this season, I believe the club is on a very secure financial footing and although we still have loans outstanding from the purchase of Hightown and Northfield we have made all new purchases from cash flow. A very healthy picture, which I'm sure you will agree warrants the small increases in permit costs this coming season.

RDAA NEWSLETTER APRIL 2006

MATCH SECRETARY

A great season with attendance up yet again averaging 32 per match, 2 matches with nearly 40 and over 60 match members but the highlight has to be the last match of the season at **Ibsley**, which saw John Legg winning with a superb 88.5lbs of Chub (and he lost some as well) only to see disappointment from Gary Haskell whose 46.8 lbs only took 2nd.

Both of them have had a superb season, battling all year over the club championship and just 1 point gave Gary the honours (125) over John (124), both a long way ahead of the rest (myself 3rd with 103). A full list of all is on the website forums. Due to the lack of rain this winter we have had some other excellent winning weights on the river, Ron Perman 30.4lbs **Breamore**, Gary Haskell 32.3lbs **Throop**, Mick Haskell 35.4lbs **Severals** (all Dace) and Rex Samson 35.5lbs **Throop** and 24.5lbs **Parley** (the latter all roach). We did have to move one match due to a flooded river and it started with everyone having to break the ice on **Whitemoor lakes** but, even in these conditions, 47.8lbs won, by lake owner Paul Miller and there were several 20lbs + weights.

Back in the summer, **Parley Lakes** fished well, Darren Moles winning the evening series match there with 42.6lbs and in the main club match in August you needed over 40lbs to get in the top 3, with winner, Darren Stride weighing 51.3lbs. Similar

position at **Witherington** where you needed 40lbs + to get in the top 5, Bryan Hayes winning with 50.4 lbs.

Other notable winning weights were John Legg's 35lbs at **Hightown**, Alan Prangnell's 47.2lbs at **Sopley** and not forgetting the Ladies Match at **Whitemoor**, Mavis Brittain winning with 28.5lbs.

The overall season weight competition saw Gary Haskell (280.1lbs) and John Legg (268.3lbs) over 100lbs clear of the rest with Mick Bartlett 3rd (165.7lbs) and as a result both John and Gary found themselves in the final of the season Knock-Out, John taking overall win, with 3rd places to Alan Prangnell and Mick Bartlett.

The Summer evening series has been so popular that this season we extended from 6 to 8 matches. Much fun and some good weights were had by all, overall winner being Ray Sheppard with 133 points over joint runners up, Sean Seabright and Mick Bartlett with 131.

The other major change this season was to put on 2 dual venue matches, to allow some of our smaller waters to be included in the fixture list and this has proved to be very popular and indeed successful, whilst at the same time avoiding closure of our bigger waters.

Mixed fishery that fishes well all year round.

1. THE LAKE (44 swims)

Use Car park 1

Contains: roach, tench, carp, bream, chub, rudd, gudgeon, crucian carp and perch.

2. THE CANAL (20 swims)

Use Car Park 2

Contains: tench and carp.

All swims are platformed.

Fishing from October 1st - March 31st.

Dawn to dusk. No night fishing.

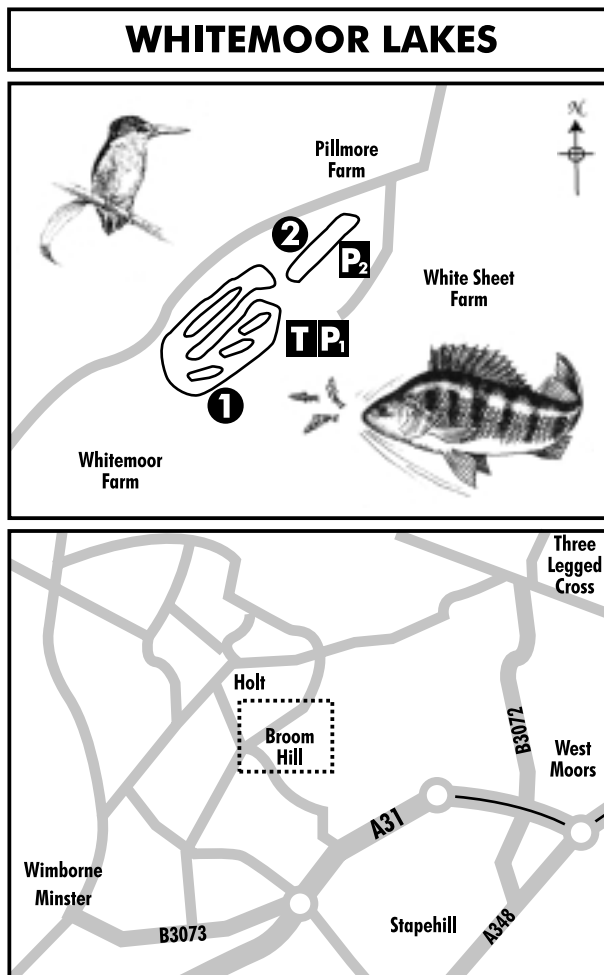
Members must:

- Use 1 rod only.
- Dip nets before fishing.
- Use barbless hooks.
- Fish from platforms only.

Members must not:

- Use keepnets.
- Use braid.
- Use bolt rigs.
- Go onto water without your permit.

On occasional days some of the water may be booked for matches.



WHINWHISTLE FISHERY WEST WELLOW

Members MUST: Book in with their permit at the lodge before going on to the fishery.

Dip landing nets prior to fishing.

No guest tickets, however, day tickets are available on site.

A beautiful complex in superb surroundings affording a good family day out, with walks through the nature reserve and woodlands.

The lakes contain mainly: roach, bream, tench, gudgeon and some carp.

Refreshments, bait and tackle are available on site with cooked breakfast available at weekends.

Fishing all year round
7.00am until dusk

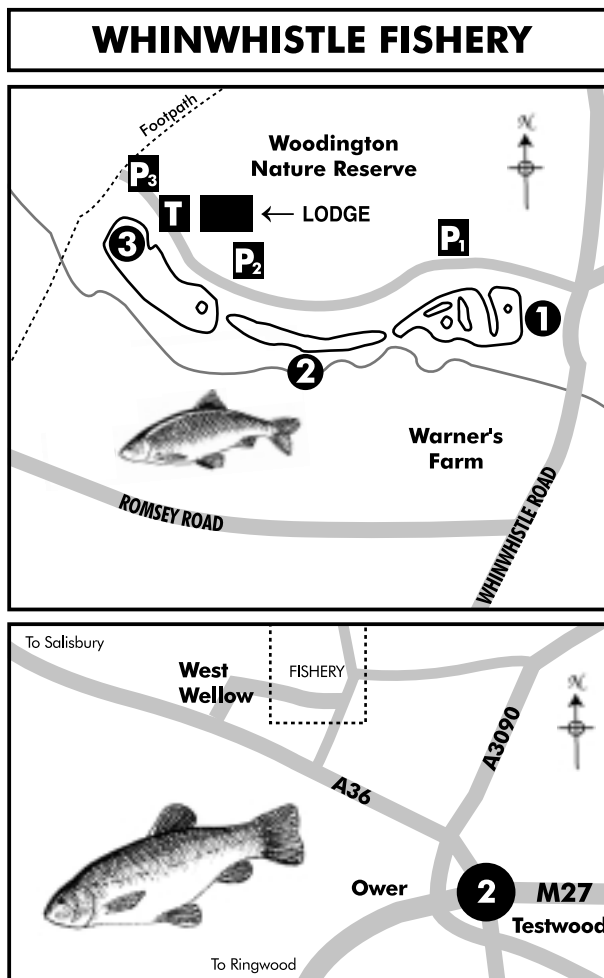
- 1. WHINWHISTLE LAKE (30 swims)

No access to trout lakes or river but members may trout fish following personal arrangements with the owners of the site.
